

## Spiders maturing

**BOXING:** It seems Luke Sheehan is sitting on a gold mine of young talent at Spiders Boxing Club.

Three of his brightest pupils, Halen Burnham, Tianah Potter and Harry Price, took home national titles at the Australian championships two weeks ago.

Potter and Price's rise to prominence has been relatively well documented, but it's 13-year-old Burnham weighing in under 34kg who has stolen the spotlight.

It was his first year fighting at the event and he proved why more than half of his opponents had pulled out of fights.

"He doesn't grow much. I think genetically he'll grow later, because he has an

older brother who didn't get bigger until 15-16," Sheehan said.

"But genetically it doesn't matter what sport he does - he kicks a\*\*\* at it," he said.

"He played footy up until last year and he'd come in with these injuries because he'd always take on the bigger guys. Some of them are massive and taller than me.

"But to describe how good he is at boxing - nobody wants to fight him. They all pull out at the last second.

"Out of 40 times, he's only actually fought about 15."

Sheehan said it was a matter of Burnham getting experience and not getting ahead of himself.

Burnham's next fight is in Townsville this week.
